OTUMFUO SUSTAINABILITY LEGACY INITIATIVE

The Office of His Majesty Otumfuo Osei Tutu II acknowledges receipt of the proposal presented by Our Mother Earth Foundation and its partners regarding the establishment of the Otumfuo Sustainability Legacy Initiative.

Following preliminary review of the initiative and its stated objectives, we note the alignment of the proposal with several areas that have long been of importance to His Majesty, including education, sustainable development, youth empowerment, cultural heritage preservation, community advancement, environmental stewardship, and engagement with the Global African Family.

His Majesty has consistently advocated the importance of creating sustainable structures capable of delivering meaningful socio-economic benefits for present and future generations while preserving the cultural heritage and values of the Ashanti Kingdom. The vision presented through the Otumfuo Sustainability Legacy Initiative reflects many of these principles and presents opportunities worthy of further exploration. The emphasis on partnerships, long-term development, and socio-economic advancement is consistent with the Kingdom's broader global vision for sustainable growth and prosperity.

Accordingly, Manhyia Palace is pleased to express its support for the continued development of the initiative and welcomes the opportunity to engage further with Our Mother Earth Foundation and its partners regarding its objectives, governance, implementation framework, and potential areas of collaboration.

The Palace is pleased to confirm its willingness to participate in the development of the Otumfuo Sustainability Legacy Initiative and establish a formal partnership framework with Our Mother Earth Foundation and its partners. The Palace considers the initiative to be consistent with His Majesty's long-standing commitment to sustainable development, education, cultural preservation, and international engagement.

To facilitate this process, the Palace will designate representatives to engage with the Foundation and associated stakeholders to review the proposed framework and identify opportunities for partnership that advance the development priorities of the Ashanti Kingdom and responsible ESG initiatives globally.

As part of this engagement, the Palace welcomes further discussion on the Ecosystem Stability & Liquidity Fund (ESLF) and the development of simple, transparent financial tools that can help direct funding toward education, sustainability, community development, climate resilience, cultural preservation, and the wider legacy objectives of the initiative, Including specific new standard submissions to the UNFCCC for consideration styled as baseline and monitoring forms, similar to those used under the Clean Development Mechanism (“CDM”), as a practical route for reviewing and certifying new types of climate projects and recognized offset instruments.

The Palace also acknowledges with appreciation the invitation extended to His Majesty regarding participation in international sustainability initiatives and climate, conventions, including:

His Majesty opening the Climate Refugees Pavilion at COP31 in Antalya, Türkiye;

The proposed Climate Week in Kumasi in 2027 and the broader Pan-African Climate Week platform;

Climate Week Dubai and associated sustainability forums;

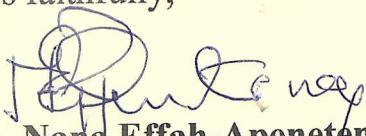
Fellowship, education, and leadership development programmes supporting future generations across Africa and the diaspora.

The arrangement for His Majesty to open the Climate Refugees Pavilion at COP31, the proposed Climate Week in Kumasi in 2027, and the broader Pan-African Climate Week platform, together with the related international engagements, will be advanced through the formal engagement process and in accordance with His Majesty's commitments, priorities, and schedule.

We look forward to working with Our Mother Earth Foundation and its partners to explore the opportunities presented through the Otumfuo Sustainability Legacy Initiative and to identify practical pathways through which the initiative may contribute to the sustainable development objectives of the Ashanti Kingdom, Ghana, Africa, and the wider Global African Family.

We are confident that through constructive engagement, strategic partnerships, and responsible stewardship, the initiative has the potential to contribute meaningfully to the long-term vision of sustainable development, cultural preservation, and socio-economic advancement that His Majesty has championed throughout his reign.
